Lazarus Community Service Summer Program Guidelines and Application

Applicants are asked both to describe their past service

experiences and to create a future program that will benefit the local community. Programs that benefit children in need while involving Ringling College students are encouraged, but other types of service ideas are also permitted. This summer program provides opportunities for Ringling College students to work individually to design and execute community projects.

This program is designed to recognize students who have concerns for the surrounding community of Sarasota and are interested in using their talent and training along with their creativity to make a difference. Funds for supplies will be available to students accepted into the program.

Guidelines and Important Information

Students must submit individual proposals for projects that will benefit the local community. Projects described in the proposal benefit a not-for-profit organization and need to be completed Summer 2017. There is no minimum requirement for the number of hours involved or duration for proposed projects. Opportunities to continue projects into the Fall 2017 term may be available.

Participants will be required to attend regular meetings (based on the duration and intensity of the project) with the Director of Student Volunteerism and Service-Learning to monitor the progress of the project and to deal with any challenges that may arise. If appropriate or necessary, students may be asked to have a mentor in the field work with them.

All majors are welcome to apply. Students graduating Spring 2017 are not eligible for this program.

Requirements

Participants must:

* Commit to serving the Sarasota area over the course of the summer

- * Be self-directed to ensure success on individual and small group projects
- * Communicate regularly with supervisors and partners
- * Submit two reccommendation letters from faculty, staff, or supervisors.
- * Be registered students.

* Be in good academic standing, have no violations of the Student Code of Conduct or have pending judicial issues.

* Track hours and projects and complete end of project self-evaluation and partner evaluation.

Students who participate and submit end of project documentation will be eligible to apply for scholarship awards, funded from the Rudi G. Lazarus Foundation, to be dispersed in the Fall 2017 Semester through the Office of Financial Aid.
